


Photo 2: LCT 229 Enclosed Farmland - Image 1




Photo 3: LCT 229 Enclosed Farmland - Image 2

View southeast from the A82 looking across the farmed river plains of LCT 342 towards rolling woodland over The Aird.






Photo 13: LCT 222 Rocky Moorland Plateau - Inverness - Image 1




Photo 16: LCT 227 Farmed Strath - Inverness - Image 1




Photo 21: LCT 291 Open Rolling Upland - Image 3

View southwest from unnamed road on the approach to Ardclach Bell Tower and Ardclach Churchyard. The attractive, narrow valley of the River Findhorn is well contained by surrounding woodland.




Photo 26: LCT 286 Narrow Wooded Valley - Moray & Nairn - Image 2

The well-wooded valley of the River Duhie can be seen, while the River Findhorn lies further west, and distinctive hills, including Cairn Eney and Cairn Duhie, associated with LCT 291 form prominent features in the background where more open farmland allows for rare, distant views through this landscape.

View southeast from unnamed road in Urchany looking across the farmed landscape associated with LCT 285 in the foreground and towards the upland moorland and forestry associated with LCT 290, seen beyond a prominent overhead line.

View north from the A941 directed along the Glen of Rothes looking towards Coleburn. Brown Muir is a distinctive moorland covered hill within the LCT and frames local views. The attractive landscape contains the detracting features of the A941 at the eastern extent of the LCT, and an overhead line is visible as it traverses the lower northwestern slopes of Brown Muir.




Photo 30: LCT 287 Broad Farmed Valley - Image 1

Photo 31: LCT 287 Broad Farmed Valley - Image 2

View south from unnamed road in Inchberry within the Spey Valley Special Landscape Area. The broad valley is contained by landform with steep, well-wooded hill slopes to the east and west, focussing views along the river with Ben Aigan a distinctive hill in the background.



Photo 32: LCT 284 Coastal Farmlands – Moray & Nairn - Image 1

View west from Earth Pillars viewpoint on Ordiequish Hill looking across the coastal farmlands landscape and River Spey Special Landscape Area towards Orbliston. Overhead lines are prominent through the broad river valley. Brown Muir can be seen from sections of the Earth Pillars trail from elevated ground but views are typically focussed through the valley or contained within woodland.

Photo 33: LCT 284 Coastal Farmlands – Moray & Nairn - Image 2
View south from a minor road to the west of the River Spey directed through the River Spey Special Landscape Area and the broad valley. The wooded steep slopes of Ordiequish Hill frame the eastern banks of the river and arable, lowland farmland. Existing 132 kV and 275 kV overhead lines form prominent vertical features through the broad, sparsely settled valley.

View southwest from a minor road to the north of Fochabers next to the Gordon Castle estate and directed across agricultural fields towards the broad River Spey valley.

Photo 35: LCT 293 Low Forested Hills - Image 1

View south from a minor road in Upper Ordiequish on the mid slopes of Ordiequish Hill to the north of Fochabers directed across agricultural fields along the Speyside Way. Views are of high scenic value with few detracting features apart from intermittent awareness of 132 kV and 275 kV overhead lines.



Photo 36: LCT 293 Low Forested Hills - Image 2

View south from minor road to the south of Upper Ordiequish. Views within the landscape are well contained by surrounding forestry and woodland. Existing towers form prominent detracting features but awareness is relatively local due to topography and intervening trees.
