Snowdrops at castle help to beckon spring

Head gardener Des Cochrane extended an invitation for people to explore the nature trail in Glamis Castle Gardens for the Snowdrop Festival.

Castle staff were on hand to speak to those taking part in the festival, explaining the single and double snowdrops known as Galanthus nivalis and Galanthus plicatus "Thee Pluck".

The festival was a chance to enjoy one of the first signs of spring, when snowdrops were planted around the gardens of Glamis Castle and to develop the woodland for next year.

The trails and sights across the wider gardens include the Italian Garden, designed by the late Queen's grandmother, Countess Cecilia.

The grounds also boast a walled garden and the atmospheric Maebeth Trail where oak, Douglas fir and noble fir sculpted figures depicting her scenes from the play are on display.
