Application (17/04217/S42) under Section 42 for non-compliance with Condition 9 of planning permission 16/00769/FUL to allow for extended working hours – including Small vehicle use of Glen Road, Tomatin - workforce trade for Tomatin Village Shop

The application under section 42 of planning permission 16/00769/FUL for the construction of Tomatin substation has now been determined and we welcome the decision by The Highland Council (THC) to approve our application.

Alistair Muir, Project Manager at Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN), said: “We welcome the decision by The Highland Council to approve our application for extended working hours. Following consultation with members of the Community Liaison Group, we further revised our application for consent and have identified and committed to limiting certain activities on Saturdays and Sundays.

“We understand the importance of working responsibly and we are fully committed to maintaining a dialogue with the local community and Dalarossie Church throughout the construction period. Project updates will be principally through the scheduled meetings of the Community Liaison Group”

We are also very pleased to report that the proposal for small vehicle use on the Glen Road to support Tomatin Village Shop has been approved. There are some “voluntary restrictions” to be agreed with the Community Liaison Group (CLG) and Strathdearn Community Council, namely the speed limit, the route plan and the trial period. The CLG will monitor the progress of the arrangement and make adjustments to the voluntary restrictions as appropriate.
